## MARTY GLICKMAN- Featured Speaker

Mention the name Marty Glickman and you think of the New York Football Giants, the New York Knicks, the New York Jets..... and UConn football and basketball.

Marty Glickman, one of the nation's top radio and television broadcasters for more than four decades, is now part of the University of Connecticut athletic family, serving as the radio "voice" of Husky football and basketball on the Connecticut Radio Network (CRN).

A pioneer in the field of sports broadcast journalism, Marty Glickman has put together an amazing career which extends to practically every corner of the sporting world.

His credits include: 29 years as a play-by-play announcer in the National Football League (23 with the New York Giants, six with the New York Jets); 21 years as broadcast voice of the New York Knicks of the NBA; 22 years of "Warm-Up Time" and "Sports Extra" for the Brooklyn Dodgers and, later, the New York Yankees; 10 years doing college basketball broadcasts as part of the Weekly Madison Square Garden presentations; serving as a consultant for Home Box Office (HBO); being regarded as a giant in the field of teaching would-be sports broadcasters the basics of the medium.

A list of his past and present students constitutes the upper echelon of his profession: Marv Albert, NBC's sports commentator and the current Knicks' play-by-play man; Spencer Ross, who eventually replaced Marty as play-by-play voice of the New York Jets on WCBS radio in New York; Sam Huff, the former Giants' linebacker now doing color commentary for the Washington Redskins football team; Nick Buoniconiti and Len Dawson, co-hosts of Home Box Office's "Inside the NFL"; and current boxing stars Sugar Ray Leonard and Marvin Hagler, who double as boxing analysts when not in the ring.

Despite a very busy "retirement" schedule, Marty has rejoined the collegiate ranks as the play-by-play voice for UConn football and basketball.

This past April, Marty added still other duties when he joined the weekend sports staff at WNBC-TV (Channel 4) in New York where he will provide sports news, commentary and features.

His unmistakable voice and unique delivery has been a trademark unmatched by any broadcaster since he originated basketball "play-by-play" on the radio.

Considered the first "jock announcer", Glickman moved into the broadcast field while a standout student-athlete at Syracuse University.

At Syracuse, Glickman was a standout football and track star and was a member of the 1936 United States Olympic Team, ranking with long-time friend Jesse Owens as one of the world's top sprinters.

A New Yorker all the way, Marty was born in the Bronx, raised in Brooklyn and currently lives on the upper East side of Manhattan.



## The UConn Club

The UConn Club, originally founded in 1953 for the purpose of supporting the University of Connecticut athletic program within the framework of the school's policy, recently offered to join the new UConn Athletic Development Fund.

The UConn Athletic Development Fund was designed to provide student aid, improve facilities and advance the overall development of the entire athletic program — all long-standing goals of the UConn Club. UConn Club membership is open to alumni and non-alumni.

## The Red O'Neill Story

The development of an award in Red O'Neill's memory did not occur accidentally. For two years a UConn Club award committee researched various possibilities. Despite the many alumni considered all signs pointed to the Redhead as the man who combined the highest attributes of character, leadership, athletic ability and, later, a successful career.

The O'Neill Award is given annually to UConn men who have gone from the athletic fields to distinguish themselves in their chosen careers.

As an outstanding athlete, Red had to overcome the severe handicap of a silver plate in his right arm, the result of a World War I wound. In 1924 he was the captain and fullback of the only unbeaten football team in UConn history.

As a student he was brilliant, getting top honors. After graduation in 1925, he went to the Yale Medical School. As a surgeon he was well known. In his later years, he was known for his work in obstetrics. He gave 23 years of his life to medicine before passing away in 1955.

O'Neill Award

Louis N. Mooradian

As an outstanding student-athlete during his undergraduate days at Connecticut, and now as a prominent executive in the business world, Lou Mooradian has always been a success story.

A native of Haverhill, MA, Lou was a three-year college football standout at Connecticut, graduating from the UConn School of Business Administration in 1958. While at UConn, Mooradian was an outstanding offensive guard, serving as co-captain of both the 1956 and 1957 teams.

The 1956 Huskies finished 6-2-1 and won the Yankee Conference title and the 1957 squad was 5-4-1 and shared the Yankee Conference crown.

Lou was an All-Yankee Conference pick in both his junior and senior seasons and as a senior added to his list of awards by being selected to the All-New England and All-East collegiate All-Star teams.

With Lou anchoring the offensive line, UConn started a streak in 1956 of 18 Yankee Conference games without a loss (16-0-2). That mark, which was stopped in 1960, still stands as a school and conference record.

The 1956 UConn team established two offensive marks which have stood the test of time during the past 25 years and still rank at top of the Husky football record list---437 yards rushing vs. Massachusetts; and 33 touchdowns rushing for the season.

In 1969, when college football was celebrating its 100th anniversary, the University of Connecticut (by vote of its alumni) selected an "All-Time Football Team." One of the guards on that "All-Time" UConn squad was Lou Mooradian.

As an undergraduate at Connecticut, Lou was elected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, was a member of the UConn Archons Honorary Society, served as President of Eta Lambda Sigma fraternity and in 1958 was the recipient of the Outstanding Senior-Athlete Award, as presented by the UConn Club.

Upon graduation from UConn in 1958, Lou worked for the Raytheon Company in Massachusetts as a contract administrator.

He returned to Connecticut in 1965, working as Materials Manager for the Stanley Works.

In 1973, Lou joined the Timex Corporation in Waterbury and in 1979 was appointed Vice President of Timex.

He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the UConn Alumni Association and is a past member of the Board of Directors of the UConn Club.

Lou resides in Wilton with his wife Patricia and daughters Kimberly and Lisa.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Kenneth B. Sweitzer

During his four seasons at Connecticut, Ken Sweitzer ran the football passed it, caught it, and kicked it. And he did it all so well Ken Sweitzer would finish his collegiate career having established four all-time New England collegiate football marks as well as setting 13 all-time UConn grid records.

Another in-state product from Hand High in Madison, Ken set New England marks for single season total offense (2,571 yards in 1981); single season passing yardage (2,190 yards in 1981); career total offense (6,126 yards from 1978-81); career passing yards (4,949 yards from 1978-81).

UConn fans got an indication they has someone special in Ken when, during his freshman season, he led UConn in passing, receiving, punt returns and scoring.

Ken started his career as a wide receiver, moved to quarterback late in his frosh season, was forced back to a receiving post following a shoulder injury in his sophomore season, and concluded his final two seasons as a record-setting QB at Connecticut.

He finished his career with a school record 37 touchdown passes and co-captained the 1981 Husky squad while being named by both AP and UPI as the first team All-New England quarterback. He was also the Yankee Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1981 and was a first team YC pick as both the quarterback and punter.

UConn's "Mr. Everything" on the football field, Ken Sweitzer was as AP All-American honorable mention in both 1980 and 1981.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Cornelius A. Thompson

The curtain has come down on a superb four-year collegiate career for one of the most popular athletes in University of Connecticut history--- Corny Thompson.

In four years at UConn, Corny scored 1,810 points---No.2 on the all-time Husky basketball point list.

The in-state hero from Middletown played in more games (114) and converted more free throws (496) than any other basketball player in UConn's long and proud history.

Corny started his college career in stunning fashion, helping lead UConn to the 1979 ECAC New England title and into the NCAA tourney (earning New England Player of the Year honors in the process).

He followed that with three consecutive seasons of outstanding play in the BIG EAST Conference, earning first team all-league honors in both his junior and senior seasons.

Corny was a consensus four-time All-New England pick while at UConn and twice was named New England College Player of the Year. He was also a two-time pick on the Widener All-East team following his junior and senior seasons.

He concluded his Husky career with a 15.9 scoring average and an 8.9 rebounding average but there was much more than those statistics to Corny Thompson's game.

Corny was named by Basketball Times to its 1981-82 All-American Third Team and at the conclusion of his senior season at Connecticut was named to participate in four prestigious post-season all-star games---the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) game in New Orleans; the Pizza Hut Classic in Las Vegas; the Aloha Classic in Honolulu; and the Sertoma Classic in Indianapolis.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Lorie L. McCollum

Honored as a collegiate All-American in 1981, Lorie played a major role in helping guide Connecticut to the NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championship last November.

A local product of E.O. Smith High School in Storrs, Lorie led three assists in tournament play at past all competition to claim the title.

A co-captain of the 1981 national championship squad, Lorie was the team's leading scorer with 10 goals and 12 assists. She concluded her UConn career with 25 goals and 14 assists.

Following the national championship title game against UMass, Lorie was selected by ESPN as the "Player of the Game" in the championship contest. She was also selected to the NCAA Division I "Final Four" team.

UConn finished its 1981 season with a record of 11-1-1. Connecticut's field hockey record with the Huskies was 59-16-11.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Pedro G. DeBrito

A two-time collegiate All-American while at Connecticut, Pedro DeBrito would cap a brilliant career with the Huskies by helping guide UConn to the NCAA Division I Soccer Championship in 1981.

A product of Wilby High School in Waterbury (no high school soccer), Pedro came to UConn and immediately established himself on the soccer field. In four years at Connecticut, Pedro would play in all 100 variety contests and UConn would register an overall record of 79-18-3 in that four-year period.

Pedro set all-time New England and UConn marks for assists in a career (59) and in a season (20 twice). In the 1981 national championship season, Pedro had 10 goals and 20 assists.

The multi-talented forward finished his Husky career with 17 goals and 20 assists (second on the all-time UConn list) and was an All-American pick in 1979, 80, 81.

He was honored as the co-Most Valuable Player on the Husky soccer squad and was selected to participate in the prestigious Senior Bowl.

He was a finalist in voting for the Hermann Trophy (top collegiate soccer player in the nation) and was the No. 1 pick in the nation in the annual North American Soccer League (NASL) pro draft. He is currently playing pro soccer as a member of the Tampa Bay Rowdies.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Elvis A. Comrie

The leading scorer on the UConn soccer team in both 1980 and 1981, Elvis concluded an outstanding collegiate career by being named an All-American in 1981 and helping Connecticut to the national soccer championship.

A product of Fort Hamilton High School in Queens Village, NY, Elvis was a three-year starter at UConn and 1981 (the championship season) he led the Huskies in scoring with 15 goals and 16 assists.

He totaled 55 career goals (second on the all-time UConn list) and added 35 assists. He tied with teammate Pedro DeBrito for second on the all-time UConn point list (145 career points each).

His 16 assists in 1981 were second only on the all-time school list to DeBrito's 20.

Elvis was a two-time All-New England pick in 1980 and 1981.

Following his senior season at Connecticut, Elvis was drafted and signed by the Montreal Manic of the North American Soccer League (NASL). He is currently competing for the Manic in the NASL outdoor season.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Michael A. McKay

Excitement, be it in the form of a patented long-range jumper or a jarring slam dunk, has been a trademark Mike McKay established while playing basketball at the University of Connecticut.

Mike played (and started) more games than any other player in UConn basketball history (114) in his four years of varsity competition and ended his college career with 1,633 points, fourth on the all-time Connecticut point list.

While at Connecticut, Mike was a major factor in a four-year record of 78-37 and four consecutive trips to post-season national tournaments.

The product of Warren Harding High in Bridgeport was the leading scorer for the 1981-82 Huskies (14.3) and he finished his four-year career with that identical scoring average.

Mike was an All-New England first team all-star in his senior season and was named to the BIG EAST Conference All-Star second team as a senior.

In addition to his efforts for UConn, Mike represented Connecticut as a member of the 1980 BIG EAST All-Star team which toured Yugoslavia.

Mike received fine reviews recently following competition in the 30th annual Portsmouth (Va.) Invitational Tournament, playing on the championship team in that eight-team "senior all-stars" tourney and averaging 12 points per game.



Outstanding Senior Athlete Award

Felice M. Duffy

A first team All-American in 1981 as selected by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Felice was a major force in helping UConn compile an overall mark of 17-3-1 and a third place finish in the AIAW national tournament.

A graduate of E.O. Smith High School in Storrs, Felice added to her All-American honor by being named to the All-New England and Region I East All-Star first teams in 1981.

She was an outstanding midfielder at UConn and played on all three Husky squads since the sport joined the varsity intercollegiate lists at Connecticut.

UConn's overall record during the past three seasons is 41-13-3 and her three-year varsity scoring totals showed 27 goals and 15 assists. In 1981, Felice scored seven goals and added seven assists.

In the national tournament in North Carolina, Felice scored twice and assisted on two other goals as UConn won three of four clashes.

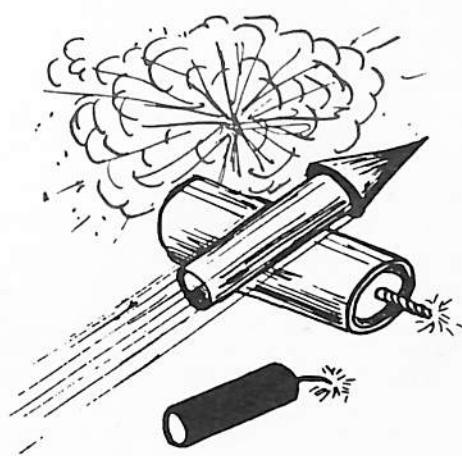
