The UConn Club

The UConn Club, which operates in compliance with all the rules and regulations of the National Collegiate Athletic Association was originally founded in 1953. In the 25th Silver Anniversary year, 1978, the UConn Club officers and Board of Directors rewrote their charter and joined the new UConn Athletic Development Fund. This was the beginning of a new UConn Club, an organization of loyal and dedicated alumni, parents, and friends of the University of Connecticut who wish to express their support to the University through their particular interest in UConn Athletics. UConn Club membership is open to alumni and non-alumni.

The Red O'Neill Story

The development of an award in Red O'Neill's memory did not occur accidentally. For two years a UConn Club award committee researched various possibilities. Despite the many alumni considered, all signs pointed to the Redhead as the man who combined the highest attributes of character, leadership, athletic ability and, later, a successful career.

The O'Neill Award is given annually to UConn men who have gone from the athletic fields to distinguish themselves in their chosen careers.

As an outstanding athlete, Red had to overcome the severe handicap of a silver plate in his right arm, the result of a World War I wound. In 1924 he was the captain and fullback of the only unbeaten football team in UConn history.

As a student he was brilliant, getting top honors. After graduation in 1925, he went to Yale Medical School. As a surgeon he was well known. In his later years, he was known for his work in obstetrics. He gave 23 years of his life to medicine before passing away in 1955.

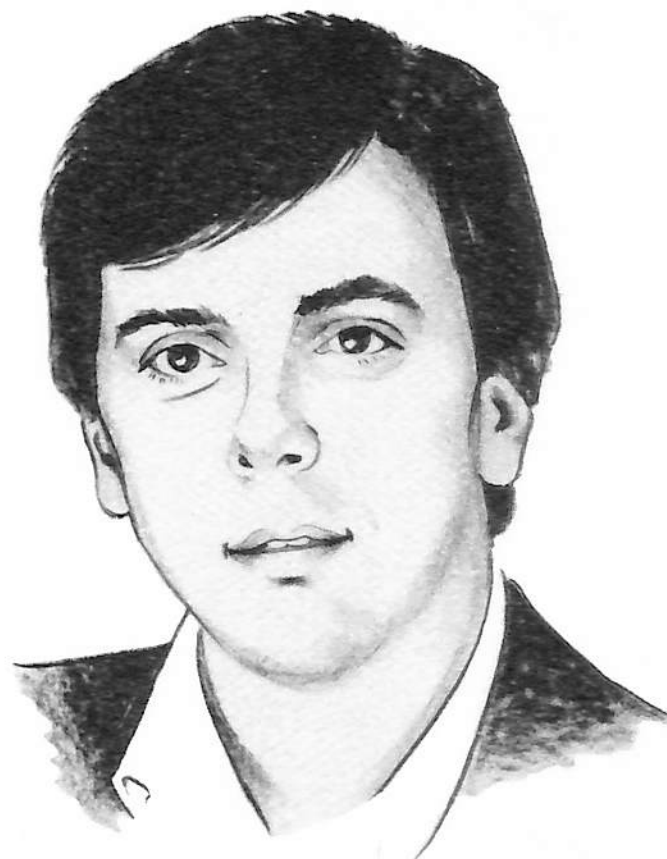

Aldrage B. Cooper, Jr.
Class of '59

Success is a word synonymous with Aldrage (Al) Cooper, Jr.--- both as a talented student-athlete at The University of Connecticut in the 1950's and as a distinguished political and business leader in his native New Jersey during the past 25 years.

A native of New Brunswick, NJ, Al Cooper came to The University of Connecticut in the fall of 1955 to begin an outstanding four-year career. At six-foot-eight, he was listed in the Connecticut Basketball Media Guide during that period as the "tallest player to ever wear a UConn uniform."

After leading the 1955-56 Husky freshman team in scoring with a 20.8 average, Al vaulted onto the varsity level and became an immediate "impact" player.

As a sophomore in 1956-57, he averaged 12.6 points per game and led the club in rebounding with an 11.8 average. As a junior, he scored 12.5 points per game and added 11.0 rebounds per outing. In both those years, he was a First Team All-Yankee Conference and All-District One pick.

In his senior season, "Coop" suffered a broken hand in pre-season practice and saw duty in only 15 of the club's 24 games, scoring 9.7 points per game and adding 8.4 rebounds per game.

For his three-year varsity career, Al Cooper scored 798 points (11.9 avg.) and added 708 rebounds (10.6 avg.). He is No. 6 on the all-time UConn career rebound average list at 10.6 and No. 10 on the career total rebound list at 708. In each of his three varsity seasons, Al led the Huskies in field goal percentage shooting.

As he realized success at Connecticut, Al Cooper also helped the Huskies realize important team success. UConn won three straight Yankee Conference titles and three consecutive NCAA tournament berths while compiling an overall three-year varsity mark of 51-25.

After earning his marketing degree in 1959, Al Cooper moved from the athletic arena to the business world while also finding time to stay active in both political and education circles.

Since 1968, Al has been associated with Johnson & Johnson in his hometown of New Brunswick, NJ. From 1968-80, he served as Manager of Public Affairs and since 1980 has been Director of Public Affairs, Corporate Relations Department.

Included among his many activities and affiliations are: a 1985 appointment by Governor Thomas Kean on the New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing; a member of the Commission on Cancer Research; a member of the Rutgers University Board of Trustees from 1978-84; a member of the New Jersey Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Judicial Conduct from 1979-83; a member of the New Jersey Economic Development Authority from 1973-81; President of the New Brunswick (NJ) City Council from 1967-74; member and vice-president of the New Brunswick Board of Education from 1965-67.

He also served as mayor of his native New Brunswick, NJ in 1974-75.

Al and his wife Judith live in New Brunswick and have one son, Aldrage III (22), and one daughter, Jill (19).

When you think of Connecticut Athletics and of loyal and active supporters, you think of Al Kelland.

Since his undergraduate days on the Storrs campus (1960-64), Al Kelland has been a UConn man.

After serving with the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps from 1964-66, Al moved into the business world and since 1972 has been associated with the Xerox Corporation as an Account Executive.

Along with his busy business schedule, Al has found time to become a dedicated supporter of all Husky intercollegiate squads.

He has been a member of The UConn Club Board of Directors for 15 years and served as UConn Club President for three years. Al also has served for nine years as chairman of the annual UConn Club Awards Dinner.

In addition to being a major donor to the "new" UConn Sports Center, Al has served on the Steering Committee for the new complex. He also has served for six years on the Board of Directors of the UConn Alumni Association, involved in committee work on fund raising, legislative awareness, athletic public relations and scholarship.

Home and away, Al Kelland is a vocal supporter of "his" Huskies. In fact, when he lists his hobbies, No. 1 on that list is Connecticut Athletics.

Al and his wife Nancy live in Southington with their children, Christopher (14) and Jennifer (10).

Catherine L. Shankweiler

A standout four-year varsity starter as a forward on Connecticut's nationally-ranked women's soccer team who led the team in scoring each of the past three seasons.

Cathy started all 82 games over the past four seasons as the Huskies compiled an overall record of 66-12-4 and advanced to the NCAA "Final Four" three times.

She finished her Husky career No. 2 on the all-time scoring list with 110 points (44 goals, 22 assists). Cathy is No. 2 in career goals with 44 and No. 3 in career assists with 22. She is one of only two standouts to surpass the 100-point plateau in Connecticut women's soccer history.

Among her individual honors, Cathy was named an All-American while at Connecticut, was a two-time All-Northeast pick, and a three-time All-New England selection. Following the 1985 season, she was named to the elite 30-member ISAA "National Senior Recognition Team."

During her senior season in 1985, Cathy registered 10 goals and five assists, including seven game-winning scores. As a junior, Cathy led UConn in scoring with 13 goals and seven assists and the Huskies ended the 1984 season No. 2 in the nation (NCAA National Runner-Up).

Cathy is a graduate of E.O. Smith HS in Storrs, CT.

Mark E. Michaels

One of the most decorated defensive football players ever at Connecticut, Mark capped off a fine four-year career with an outstanding senior season.

A starter in all of UConn's games the past three seasons, this past season he was named the Yankee Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year and has been a two-time first team All-ECAC and All-New England performer. He was a first-team Yankee Conference selection last year and reaped second-team honors as a junior.

A constant pressure to opposing quarterbacks and running backs, he has been the team's leader in sacks over the last two years. In those two seasons, he sacked the opposing quarterback 20 times for minus 136 yards while he was credited with dropping running backs a total of 13 times for minus 32 yards. He was the leading overall tackler as a junior and was third on the club this past fall, totalling 178 hits.

The son of former pro standout Walt Michaels, Mark is a graduate of St. John Baptist HS in New York and Milford (CT) Academy.

Timothy A. Coles

One of the most popular athletes to ever play basketball at Connecticut, Tim concluded an outstanding four-year varsity career by putting together a superb senior season.

A senior co-captain during the 1985-86 season, Tim finished his final year by averaging 13.1 points per game and added 9.3 rebounds per game. He led UConn in rebounding each of the past three seasons.

Tim finished his four-year career No. 5 on the all-time BIG EAST Conference rebounding list and he leaves UConn No. 8 on the all-time Husky rebound list with 804. He also stands No. 8 at UConn in games played (110), missing only two games (knee injury) in four varsity seasons while starting 82 consecutive games over his final three seasons.

He finished his UConn career with 1,016 points, one of only 17 athletes to belong to the 1,000-point scoring club at Connecticut.

Tim was No. 2 in the BIG EAST in free throw shooting (83%) as a junior and placed No. 3 in the BIG EAST in rebounding in both his sophomore and senior seasons.

In his rock-solid senior season, Tim notched 12 "double-doubles" in points and rebounds. Over his four-year career, he averaged 7.3 rebounds per game.

Tim is a graduate of Cardinal Gibbons HS in Baltimore, MD.

Andrew D. Pantason

Andy blossomed into one of the top goalkeepers in the nation as a senior in 1985, earning First Team All-American honors from "Kick Magazine" and being named starting goalie for the East All-Stars in the 1985 Senior Bowl Soccer Classic.

During his varsity career at Connecticut, Andy was 40-16-6 in net with a 0.93 goals against average. He owns both the single season and career shutouts and career shutout victories record. He is second all-time in career victories and third in career saves.

As a senior in 1985, he was 17-4-3 in goal with an outstanding 0.70 goals against average. The 17 wins in net were the most in a single season at UConn since 1976 and the second-highest total ever.

Last fall, in his senior season, Andy was the BIG EAST Conference Northern Division Player of the Year, was named First Team All-New England goalie, was Soccer America magazine National Player-of-the-Week in early September, was the Most Outstanding Defensive Player at the Adidas-Metropolitan Life Classic hosted by Indiana University, and was a member of the BIG EAST All-Tournament team.

Andy is a graduate of Walt Whitman HS in Huntington Station, NY.

Donna L. MacDougall

A two-time All-American during a superb four-year varsity career at Connecticut, Donna was a starter in all four of her collegiate seasons on UConn's powerful women's soccer squad.

She co-captained the 1984 & 1985 squads, earning All-America recognition both years. Donna closed out her career tied with fellow senior Missy Morrone for No. 3 on the all-time scoring list with 32 goals and 21 assists for 85 points. She finished fourth in the UConn record books in career goals (32) and in career assists (21). She was named to the elite 30-member ISAA National "Senior Recognition Team" after the 1985 season.

Donna was a two-time selection to the NCAA All-Tournament team. As a junior, when UConn sported a 17-4-2 record while finishing as the NCAA Division I National Runner-Up, Donna was a First Team All-American while also earning NCAA All-Tournament honors and being named a First Team All-Northeast and All-New England pick.

During her four years at Connecticut, the Huskies compiled an overall record of 66-12-4, winning the NCAA Northeast Regional title three times and advancing to the NCAA "Final Four" three times.

Donna is a graduate of Hanover Park HS in Hanover, NJ and a resident of Florham Park, NJ.

A four-year varsity letter winner in women's basketball at Connecticut and a starter in her senior season who served as tri-captain of the 1985-86 Husky squad, which compiled its best record in five seasons.

Audrey saved her best basketball for her senior season, starting 26 of 27 games while averaging 4.8 points and 2.5 assists per game. She was No. 3 in assists and fourth in steals in her senior season. Audrey led Connecticut at the foul line in '85-'86, hitting 87.5% from the stripe.

She played in 92 varsity contests over her four-year career and saw action in all 52 of UConn's games as a junior and senior.

Audrey participated in the Maccabiah Games in Israel during the summers of 1981 and 1985. She is a Dean's List student in Sports Marketing with a 3.38 GPA.

In January, Audrey was one of five University of Connecticut students asked to serve on University President John T. Casteen's Athletic Task Force.

Matthew R. Addington

A gifted athlete, Matt Addington concluded a superb four-year varsity soccer career at Connecticut by earning All-American recognition as a senior.

One of only a handful of Husky players to start on the varsity level as a freshman, Matt guided UConn to a four-year overall mark of 62-25-12, four consecutive trips to the NCAA tourney, and a pair of visits to the NCAA "Final Four." Over the past four seasons, the Connecticut Soccer program has been ranked no lower than No. 12 in the nation.

Matt played in 96 of a possible 98 matches in his four-year career and scored 52 goals while adding 23 assists for 126 points. He was UConn's leading scorer in three of his four years and ranks among the top three all-time at Connecticut in goals and points. His 20 goals as a senior were the second most in a single season at UConn and his 17 goals as a junior were third highest.

In addition to his All-American honor, Matt was named to participate in the 1985 Senior Bowl Classic and earned the Senior Bowl Leadership Award. He was a two-time BIG EAST Conference All-Tournament team pick, was the 1984 BIG EAST tourney MVP, and earned All-New England honors three times.

Matt is a graduate of Bishop O'Connell HS in McLean, VA.

A four-year varsity athlete at Connecticut and a three year starter at third base for UConn's nationally-regarded women's softball team.

One of the top scholar-athletes to ever play at Connecticut, Millie is a Pre-Law/Political Science major who was honored last spring as a 1985 College Sports Information Directors of America First Team All-District and National Honorable Mention Academic All-America. She is a four-year Dean's List student, sporting a 3.90 GPA.

A standout defensive performer, Millie had a .991 fielding percentage in 1985 with only one error in 108 chances. Offensively, she hit .259 with 8 RBI in '85 and was No. 2 on the team with seven stolen bases as the Huskies recorded an overall record of 34-7 while winning the ECAC Division I title and attaining the No. 1 ranking in New England and the No. 2 ranking in the Northeast.

Millie is again busy this spring as she and her UConn softball teammates eye a possible NCAA post-season tournament bid.

Millie is a graduate of Northport HS in Northport, NY.

Melissa A. Morrone

A highly-skilled athlete who performed brilliantly at both the forward and midfield positions as a varsity starter for four consecutive seasons on Connecticut's nationally-ranked women's soccer team.

Missy earned numerous individual honors during her career, including being named a collegiate All-American. She was No. 2 in team scoring as a senior in 1985 with six goals and eight assists (20 points), tying for the team lead in assists. She concluded her career at UConn with 26 goals and 33 assists, tying for No. 3 on Connecticut's all-time scoring list (85 points). Missy is also No. 2 in career assists and No. 6 in career goals.

A First Team All-New England and All-Northeast pick twice, Missy was also named to the elite 30-member ISAA National "Senior Recognition Team" in 1985. She was also a two-time pick as an NCAA All-Tournament team member.

Missy becomes the third member of the Morrone family to earn All-America soccer honors at Connecticut and also the third member of her family to be recognized by the UConn Club as an "Outstanding Senior Athlete." Her older brothers Joe ('81) and Bill ('83) were previously honored.

Missy is a graduate of E.O. Smith HS in Storrs, CT.

One of the finest male scholar-athletes to wear a Connecticut varsity uniform, Jack Prior is the 1985-86 BIG EAST Conference Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Over his four-year career, he has combined a 3.64 grade point average in Chemical Engineering with a stand-out career in track and field.

He is currently ranked among the top 100 decathletes in the nation and is the defending champion and three-time winner of the Boston College Relays Decathlon championship. He was a member of the 1983 U.S. Junior National Team, a two-time qualifier for the IC4A Championships, and is the UConn freshman record holder in both the pentathlon and decathlon.

In the classroom, he has been on the Dean's List every semester since enrolling as a freshman, is a member of two national honor societies, was named to the District I All-Academic Team by the College Sports Information Directors of America, has been active with the NCAA Volunteers for Youth program, and is listed in "Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities."

He is a graduate of Naugatuck HS in Naugatuck, CT.

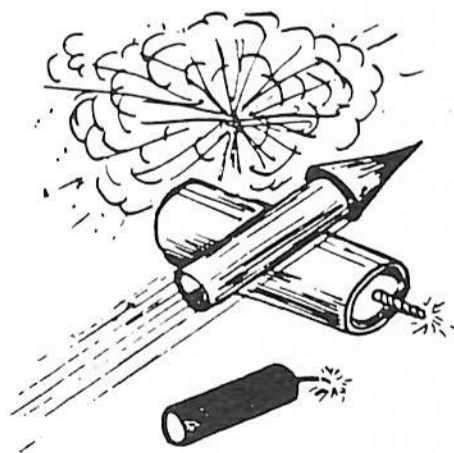
